PAUL BOYD

Paul's performing career spanned 25 years in companies in Germanu, Switzerland, and at Oueensland Ballet. He danced the major classics as well as works by Kylian, Forsythe, Ek, Christe, Balanchine, Neumeier, Petit, Weir, and Klaus, among others, and received the German Critics Award for Best Up and Coming Artist and Best Established Artist in Europe. Paul's choreographic works have been performed by Queensland Ballet, The Australian Ballet (Bodytorque season), Bundesjugendballett (Hamburg), Suzhou Ballet Theatre (China), Hong Kong Academy of Performing Arts, WAAPA, QUT, Sydney City Youth Ballet, and Hong Kong Ballet Group. Uneven Ground was performed by the Royal Ballet School (London), as well as touring to New York and Japan. Paul has been Guest Teacher for the Royal Ballet School, Hong Kong Ballet, Semperoper and Deutsche Oper am Rhein (Germany), West Australian Ballet and Perth's Graduate College, and Architanz (Tokyo).

TERI CRILLY

Teri was born in Bunbury, Western Australia and completed the National Theatre Ballet School's Advanced Diploma of Arts (Classical) in 2006. She then spent a year performing at Tokyo Disney Resort in Japan before accepting a three-month contract with The Australian Ballet's Out There schools program. Teri was a guest dancer in Queensland Ballet's production of The Nutcracker in 2007 and entered the Company's Professional Year program in January 2008, before joining the Company in 2009. Teri was promoted to Demi-Soloist in July 2015. During her career, Teri has performed many featured roles such as Swanhilda (Coppélia), Cinderella, Sugar Plum Fairy (The Nutcracker), Kitri (Don Quixote) and Wendy (Peter Pan). In 2011, Teri made her professional choreographic debut with From the Shadows as part of the Company's Vis-à-vis season and quickly followed this with two more works in 2012 with Estoy Aqui and Nara, both premiering at Oueensland Ballet's Thomas Dixon Centre.

ALICE TOPP

JACK LISTER

Following his training at The Australian Ballet School, Jack Lister joined Queensland Ballet as Company Artist in 2014. As a choreographer, Jack has collaborated with Brisbane-based art galleries, designers, and creatives, producing photographic, film and large scale projections for events and festivals. His first choreographic work for Queensland Ballet, Memory House, premièred as part of Dance Dialogues in late 2015. This was closely followed by Jack's second work Fonder Heart, which premiered in 2016, also for the Dance Dialogues season. Strong, fluid and assertive, Fonder Heart was described as "sleek, sophisticated and intriguing" by dance critic Deborah Jones, and is currently nominated for an Australian Dance Award. In 2017, Jack created Rational/Animal as part of Queensland Ballet's inaugural Bespoke season, which received both critical and audience acclaim.

Alice was born and raised in Bendigo and started dancing at the age of four. She began her dance studies at a local school before attending the Victorian College of the Arts Secondary School for a year in 1998; she then undertook four years of full-time classical training at Ballet Theatre of Victoria. After two years with Royal New Zealand Ballet, Alice joined The Australian Ballet in 2007 and has danced in a wide range of classical and contemporary repertoire. Alice has a passion for choreography and has created four critically acclaimed works for the company's Bodytorque seasons. In 2014 she choreographed an intimate pas de deux, performed by Rudy Hawkes and Vivienne Wong, for Megan Washington's Begin Again music video; in 2016 her first mainstage work, Little Atlas, premiered at the Sydney Opera House as part of The Australian Ballet's Symphony in C program. She was promoted to coryphée in 2017.
